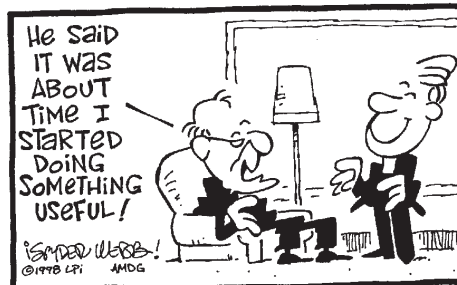

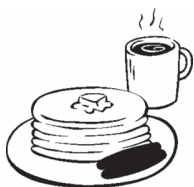

Question of the Week

For the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"...convinced of their own righteousness...." How comfortable are you in declaring your own sinfulness? If accused of being a sinner, how tempted would you be to immediately respond by saying that you are not as bad as...? How convinced are you that God "knows no favorites"? What feeling arise in you when someone proclaims that a miracle of healing occurred because of their strong prayers? What's the implication? How do you explain that God heard your prayers when it appears you didn't get what you prayed for?

Pope Benedict XVI - Families Teach Meaning of Life

The family is fundamental because it is the first place where people learn the meaning of life, Benedict XVI is affirming. "The relationship between parents and children -- you know -- is fundamental," the Holy Father affirmed. He noted that "it is the torch of faith that is



passed on from generation to generation, this flame that is also present in the rite of baptism, when the priest says: 'Receive the light of Christ ... the paschal sign ... the flame that you must always keep alive.'

"The family is fundamental because it is the place where there germinates in the human soul the first perception of the meaning of life," Benedict XVI affirmed. "This perception grows in the relationship with the mother and with the father, who are not the owners of the life of the children but the first collaborators with God in the transmission of life and the faith," he added.

The Bishop of Rome went on to explain that "the family is the 'little Church' because it transmits God, it transmits the love of Christ, by the power of the sacrament of matrimony." He added that "the family, to be a 'little Church,' must be well integrated into the 'big Church,' that is, into the family of God that Christ came to form."

"The greatest gift that we have received is to be Church," the Pontiff affirmed, "to be in Christ the sign and instrument of unity, of peace, and true freedom."
